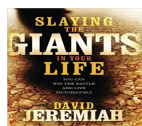

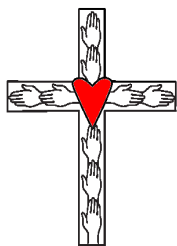
Workers Schedule
