### **Grapevine Art Project Completes Winter Show at the Lancaster Theater**

The Grapevine Art Project held a winter exhibition and juried competition at the Lancaster Theater during the months of November and December, at which original work by a number of local artists was on display. The theme of the show was Winter Wonderland, in keeping with both the holiday season and Grapevine's "Christmas Capitol of Texas" theme.

An expert jury awarded ribbons to the best works. The First Place ribbon went to Chris Brandley for "Snow Fall," a painting showing winter in New York City's Central Park. Second Place ribbon went to Bruce Rosenstiel for "Sandhill Cranes," a photograph of cranes taking flight over sand dunes. Two Honorable Mention ribbons went to Charice Cooper for a painting titled "Winter Hunt" and to Klaus Mayer for a photograph titled "Winter Wonderland in Sedona."

During the month of December, the members voted to revise and update the official bylaws, and also held officer elections. The position of President is held by Katie Richarme, moving from Executive Vice President (President Elect) to that position for a two year term. Elected to the position of Executive Vice President (President Elect) is Betty Enmon. At the end of her two year term, Betty will step into the position of President. Elected to the office of Vice President-Communications is Naomi Fron, also for a two year term. At the end of 2018, the positions of Secretary and Treasurer will be up for election.

The Grapevine Art Project will attend the upcoming A Taste of Apex Arts League on Thursday, January 25 at the MARQ in Southlake, where they will have membership representatives available to answer questions.
