A relatively new feature of the show is a silent auction twice each day, with all proceeds from the silent auction going toward the GCISD Student Art Scholarship program.

The dates are March 9 and 10.

The Grapevine Art Project holds monthly meetings on the second Thursday evening of each month, often featuring presentations and demonstrations from highly regarded artists in many diverse media. Visitors are welcome to attend and learn more about the organization, its members, and programs. Artists include painters, photographers, potters, jewelers, sculptors, weavers, and other visual media formats. New members, even those who are not artists, are always welcome.
