Birds of a Feather

I'd like to share a true story with you. As the above picture indicates; it involves a bird caught in a terrible trap, and what we are able to do to help. While on a vacation in Florida several years ago; my younger son, Jake and I were fishing from a dock. It was a really hot day, around lunch time. We decided that since the fish were not biting were going to get some pizza. Just as we were packing up our equipment; we noticed a bird fly past us. We also noticed that hanging from its foot hung a fishing line and a lead shot. The bird was doing fine until it flew above some trees. Every time I see it; it reminds me that even when we know that we are not fully capable, or have doubts and fears; God will help us. It is up to us to be faithful to our call, and reach up as high as we can. After that, God will reach down to us and fill the gap.
