



## Update On William Chan



Australian Rotary Global Grant Scholar William Chan update July 2019

Australian Architect and designer HY William Chan has been named on the “30 Under 30 – Asia Pacific” in 2019 list published annually by international business magazine Forbes. The Forbes Asia under 30 list features the regions 300 brightest Innovators and Disruptors.

William is an urban designer at Cox Architecture and in his spare time has been innovating in the plastic upcycling field. He was listed under the “Industry, Manufacturing and Energy” subcategory and is the only honouree currently working in architecture as a game-changing business and industry leader.

William is an urbanist and designer dedicated to creating resilient and inclusive places for people. A UNICEF Young Ambassador during the 25th anniversary of the Convention of the Rights of the Child, William has led community-building projects for the homeless, slum dwellers and refugee youth.

William’s architecture and design solutions have been showcased across 40 cities, most notably at the Venice and Rotterdam Biennales, Oslo and Milan Triennales, New York Centre for Architecture, UN World Urban Forum and Sydney Design Festival. He co-authored the UN-Habitat World Urban Youth Declaration and represented global leaders in launching the UN Youth 2030 Strategy at the 2018 General Assembly in New York. His most recent project is a plastic waste recycling scheme for refugees was presented to the United Nations in 2018.

HY William Chan is not only interested in designing the cities that we live in, but how we can all be a part of the process. He challenges us to disrupt our understanding of refugee camps as future cities and incubators of innovation. Can refugees be empowered to transform their own environments through the circular economy, and ultimately be the next generation of creatives, technologists and innovators?

He Co-created with youths at refugee camps in Greece - the project used plastic waste material at the camps, which was refined and converted into 3D-printed objects.

William is a World Economic Forum Global Shaper, Fellow with the UN Sustainable Development Solutions Network and Research Affiliate with the Centre for Sustainable Urban Development at Columbia University's Earth Institute.

A Convocation and University Medallist of the University of Sydney, William has been recognised with an Australian Achievement in Architecture Award for the advancement of the built environment.

“Architects have a uniquely creative skillset, but we need to be more agile and entrepreneurial in how we design solutions that address the economic and social challenges of our cities so that we remain relevant as an industry.”

He has been named one of Australia's top 100 Brightest Young Minds and an inaugural Australian Government 'Creative Young Star'. Try any one of the links to presentations by William Chan.
