

Trends

What is a Trend?

- · The trend is simply the general direction of the market.
- Markets don't generally move in a straight line in any direction but are characterized by a series of Zig-Zags.
- It's the direction of those peaks and troughs that constitutes a market trend.

Trend Direction

- An uptrend is a series of successively higher peaks and troughs.
- A downtrend is just the opposite, a series of declining peaks and troughs.
- Horizontal peaks and troughs would identify a sideways / range price trend.

Trend Direction - Range / Sideways



Trend Decisions

There are three decisions confronting the trader

- Buy (go long) only if it is a Uptrend
- Sell (go short) only if it is a Downtrend
- Do Nothing (stand aside) if it is a Range

Trend Classifications


There are three trend classifications:

- Major Tend
 - Over a year
- Intermediate Trend
- Three weeks to three months
- Near term Trend
 - Less than three weeks

Trend Classifications

Each trend becomes part of its next larger trend.






Support

- Troughs
- Bottoms
- Reaction Lows
- The level or area on the chart under the market where buying interest is sufficiently strong to overcome selling pressure


Resistance

- Peaks
- Tops
- The level or area on the chart over the market where selling pressure overcomes buying pressure
