

Bio: Prof. Christian van Nieuwerburgh (PhD) is a highly sought-after executive coach, researcher and consultant with many years of experience. He is currently Professor of Coaching and Positive Psychology in the College for Applied Health and Communities at the University of East London and Director of Growth Coaching International (GCI). Christian is relentlessly curious about the fields of coaching and positive psychology. He is particularly interested in interculturally-sensitive coaching, the creation of coaching cultures and the use of coaching and positive psychology in educational settings.

Having published extensively in the field, he is the author of the best-selling An Introduction to Coaching Skills: A Practical Guide (2017;2014) and the editor of Coaching in Education: Getting Better Results for Students, Educators and Parents (2012) and Coaching in Professional Contexts (2016). He is also a co-author (with Raja'a Allaho) of Coaching in Islamic Culture: The Principles and Practice of Ershad (Karnac, 2017) and (with John Campbell) The School Leader's Guide to Coaching in Schools (Corwin, 2017).

Considered a thought leader within the fields of coaching and positive psychology, he regularly speaks at conferences in Europe, the US, Australia and the Middle East. He is the Editor in Chief of one of the field's top coaching journals: Coaching: An International Journal of Theory, Research and Practice.
