


Serving in East Africa

On one of the trips up the mountain, a pastor pointed towards another mountain and told me that there were many villages on that side with no churches. To train up faithful men who will be able to go and teach others. The time spent in the Bible colleges and with the national pastors is for the purpose of reaching villages like those near Mt. Elgon with the Gospel.



I was able to meet his wife who was a former Muslim, she was lead to the Lord by her husbands faithful witness to her. I also was privileged to meet another young man who was lead to the Lord by Pastor Abisay . He has recently completed the Bible college and is now pastoring a church of his own. Our sovereign God is at work, and He is able to use any one of His children in the ministry of expanding His kingdom. I am thankful for Pastor Abisay and his love and passion for Christ. The time in Uganda was busy and filled with much joy. I am looking forward to returning there soon.

After the travels in Uganda, the rest of the month consisted of teaching at the Eldoret and West Pokot Bible colleges, traveling to a new church plant and teaching and baptizing some of the new believers, holding another pastors mission meeting as we discuss missions in Kenya, and of course preparing for our baby girl! We are very thankful to have two of Bethany's sisters here with us as the countdown for baby #2 approaches. They have been a big blessing and Abram loves his aunts.
